

MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Introduction

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 requires commercial organisations which supply goods or services such as Integral to prepare a slavery and human trafficking statement each financial year.

Modern slavery is a term used to cover slavery, forced and compulsory labour and human trafficking against both adults and children who are forced to work against their free will.

This new disclosure duty is a measure to encourage businesses to take steps to stop modern slavery.
